SPECIFIC OBJECTIVE1: FOOD SECURITY, NUTRITION AND LIVELIHOODS

Increasing food production and diversity

1. Established 1,267 demonstration plots.
2. Supported 33,337 households establish kitchen gardens
3. Established 145 seed multiplication gardens / Community seed banks
4. Procured and distributed 5,174 bags of Orange Fresh Sweet Potatoes (OFSP)
5. Trained 300 new Tillage Service Providers.
6. Procured and distributed a set of 22 animal traction
7. Ploughed 826 acres of land under the provision of the access to the e-voucher tillage services
8. Trained and equipped 920 community extension workers (Community Extension workers, Community Animal Health Workers, Para vets, VSLA mentors and agro-ecology champions)
9. Trained and skilled 1,300 Youth in Agro-business skills in 8 TVET institutions, placed them for internship and provided each youth with a start-up kit.
10. Trained 540 LG Production and CBS department staff 10 courses,that enhanced their knowledge in extension services.
11. Procured and supplied value addition equipment:

- A Sesame Infra-Red sterilization equipment was procured and installed at GNLD in Gulu.
- Constructed one honey processing house.
- Procured and supplied 283 Value addition equipment at household / community level (groundnut, Irish potatoes, motorized soybean threshers, motorized rice threshers, automated grain cleaners, mobile cassava chipping machines and cassava drying racks) were procured and distributed to farmer groups
- Constructed 4 machine houses.

Enhanced household incomes

1. Distributed 4,225 beehives to groups – (comprising of; bee brush, smoker, suit with veil, a pair of gloves & a pair of gumboots).
2. 3,297 VSLA groups were supported to get established, registered, build their capacity, equipped, and are saving and giving loans and linking to financial institutions and some were digitalized

Improving maternal and child nutrition

1. 17,754 Children (1-14 years), were reached with de-worming and Vitamin A services during integrated health out-reaches
2. 18,144 Children (0-59 months) reached during integrated health outreaches with immunization services.
3. 19 Sub county Nutrition Coordination Committees (SNCC) were supported
4. 9 District Nutrition Coordination Committee were supported
5. 112 Trainer of Trainers (TOT) for Community Maternal Infant Young Child and Adolescent Nutrition were trained
6. 2,352 Household Caregiver Groups (HCGs) were trained on essential nutrition and hygiene action and SRHR
7. 3,750 Nutrition mass screenings conducted by VHTs
8. 3,318 PLWHA reached through nutrition mass screenings
9. 365,400 Individuals were reached with nutrition services (education, screening, treatment and referrals)
10. 2,787 individuals were treated for malnutrition
11. 1,032 members of households (pregnant, lactating and adolescents) were supported to establish their individual household backyard gardens for household nutrition.
12. 110 lead mothers were mentored on essential hygiene and nutrition actions (infant and young child feeding and maternal nutrition).

Hygiene

- Constructed 8 public toilets.
- Drilled and constructed 15 boreholes.

Family Planning

- 20,485 Females became new users of short/medium and long term family planning contraceptives
- 103,439 women received long-term mFP methods
- 205,010 women receiving short-term mFP methods
- 70 Health workers were trained on comprehensive family planning

- 54 Health facilities conducted health integrated outreaches (family planning, immunization, nutrition assessment, deworming, supplements and HIV counselling and testing)
- 216 Youth friendly spaces were created / rehabilitated and equipped with assorted items.
- 6,942 Adolescents reached with SRHR services
- 37,584 Household members reached through dialogue on Family Planning and GBV
- 1,408 integrated health outreaches were conducted.
- 925,462 male condoms were distributed
- 9,114 Out-of-school adolescents reached through dialogues on sexuality and Family Planning

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVE2: IMPROVED INFRASTRUCTURE

District and Community Access Roads

- 404.8Km (11 roads) of district and community access roads were rehabilitated and upgraded
- Trained Technical managers and Technical Supervisors in Low Cost Sealing Technology in road maintenance course at MELTC premises.

Upgrading the Atiak - Laropi Road, 66Km - The road starts in Atiak at a junction off the Gulu – Atiak - Nimule Highway, turning left traversing through the trading centres of Dzaipi, Pakele, Adjumani town and ends at Umi at the Ferry landing site on River Nile

Logistics

- Gulu Logistics Hub (GLH) was constructed.
- Otuke Business and Governance Centre, in Otuke District; has a Banking hall, conference hall, super market, pharmacies, offices/shops, kitchen, restaurant and a play space.

Water

- **Constructed 8 new valley tanks** (Kaabong 2, Karenga 1, Kotido 2 and Amudat 3).
- Protected 14 existing valley tanks (Moroto 7, Kotido 5, Kaabong 1 and Karenga 1).
- Constructed the Lolet / Iriir piped Water Supply System – Napak.
- Constructed the Adibo piped water supply system – Yumbe.
- Developed an O&M strategy and implementation plan for sustainable management of WfP facilities and a management and technical manual on O&M of WfP facilities for MWE
- Published an annual progress report on the implementation of Catchment Management Plans of the Kyoga and Upper Nile WMZs which contains a zonal water resources report on the basis of the national water information system
- Revised the strategy for operationalisation of catchment-based water resources management

Energy

- Installation of 25 mini-grids in 25 villages in Lamwo district.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVE3: GOOD GOVERNANCE & IMPROVED SERVICE DELIVERY

Nutrition Governance

1. The programme mapped out nutrition-specific and nutrition-sensitive interventions in the district and identified the stakeholders.
2. The programme built capacity on nutrition governance, development of District Nutrition Action plans, development of annual Nutrition work plans, aligned District Nutrition Action Plans (DNAPs) to District Development Plans (DDPs), supported quarterly DNCC review and planning meetings and provided tools for monitoring.
3. MDA staff and DNCC members were trained on how to plan, budget, implement and monitor sectoral nutrition actions at district level. This resulted in the approval of nutrition work plans and allocation of funds to support nutrition program implementation.
4. 6,715 frontline service providers were trained (These are; Agriculture extension officers, Community Development Officers, Parish Development Committees, village health teams, FAL and Teachers).
5. Developed a Nutrition Comic Book - a Teacher's guide and animated cartoon for primary school children. It was officially launched by the 1st Lady and Minister of Education in October 2021. The materials were further translated into 6 commonly used languages (Alur, Lugbara, Madi, Langi, Acholi and Karamojong).
6. Conducted three (3) Food Security and Nutrition Assessments.
7. Developed a Nutrition Governance Framework.
8. A Capacity Development Plan for nutrition was developed and implemented. The Plan is to guide implementation of capacity related activities under 4 major themes; 1) Policies, Programmes and Frameworks, 2) Resource Planning, Tracking and Mobilization, 3) Coordination and Partnerships and 4) Evidence-Based Decision-Making.
9. 2 policy briefs were developed; 1) Strengthening integration of Gender in Nutrition Policies and 2) Gender integration in Nutrition program.
10. Supported the development of Standard Operation Procedures (SOPs) for nutrition governance. These provided guidance on TORs for coordination structures at national, district and sub-county levels as well as reporting templates and checklists for action plans
11. Provided technical and financial support to the Office of the Prime Minister for the review of Nutrition Advocacy, Communication and Social Mobilisation (NACS) strategy. There is now the NACS II.
12. Supported OPM to carry out a Nutrition Expenditure Review (NER) for Uganda (the 1st of its kind).
13. Supported OPM to develop a National Nutrition Investment case for Uganda
14. Provided financial and technical support to key UNAP implementing MDAs to conduct annual Nutrition sector review and planning meetings (Ministry of Gender Labour and Social Development, Ministry of Agriculture Animal Industry and Fisheries, Ministry of Health, Ministry of Education and Sports, and Ministry of Local Government.
15. Provided support to MAAIF, through the International Institute of Rural Reconstruction (IIRR), to develop Nutrition-sensitive agriculture training packages for agriculture extension workers. The materials developed under this action are used by MAAIF to build the capacity of agriculture extension workers nationally.
16. Provided technical assistance to MoES to develop a Nutrition Comic Book, a teacher's guide and animated cartoon for primary school children. The materials were officially launched by the 1st Lady and Minister of Education in October 2021. The materials were further translated into the 6 commonly used languages (Alur, Lugbara, Madi, Langi, Acholi and Karamojong) in the targeted districts.
17. Supported OPM and DLGs to carry out a Nutrition Causal Analysis (NCA) Study to understand the

situation of food and nutrition security and to explore the causal pathways in different livelihood zones in the DINU supported districts

18. Supported the development of a Nutrition Governance Framework with subsequent annual nutrition governance assessment in 15 DINU supported districts.
19. Provided technical and financial support to MAAIF to implement a Research on Nutrition Agriculture linkages aimed at understanding the local agricultural practices and how local food systems have shaped the food environment in delivering nutritious, safe, affordable and sustainable diet for children in Uganda
20. Developed 15 district Advocacy briefs

Support to Uganda Police Force

- Constructed 7 Community Police posts - Apeitolim in Napak district, Lokori Police Post in Karenga district, Namalu Police Post in Nakapiripirit district, Morulem Police Post in Abim district, Alakas Police Post in Amudat district, Nakapelimoru Police Post in Kotido district and Nakiloro Police Post in Moroto district. (The Community Police post comprises of; an office block, 2 residential blocks with 9 double rooms, 5 rain water tanks, 2 latrines with 6 stances and 2 urinals).
- They were all equipped with furniture, installed solar system, did electricity wiring (awaiting a power line), sunk 7 boreholes and supplied 14 motorcycles.
- Trained 210 Police officers in Communication skills, 210 in Human rights and 500 in Community policing.

Revenue enhancement

- Supported Integrated Revenue Administration Systems (IRAS) to enhance LR mobilization and administration. Supplied I.T equipment, motorcycles and motor vehicles to 18 LGs to enhance local revenue collection.
- In addition, Valuation of property is being finalized and there is ongoing works on supply, installation of solar PV systems and backup system to support ICT equipment used in revenue administration and management.
- 247 LG staff from Finance department were trained in data collection, created registers, printed and disseminated guidelines for Local Revenue mobilization and generation.
- A prototype for a computerized tool for tracking implementation of LGPAC recommendations was developed and piloted in 18 LGs in NU.

Land certificates / Registration

- 4,005 Certificates of Customary Owners (CCO's) were issued to land owners
- 100 titles of Public land were registered for (Sub county headquarters & health centres).
- 23 community land owners received land titles
- One Land registry office was constructed and equipped at the sub county headquarters in Maracha district.
- Trained 64 Area Land Committees (ALCs) and District Land Board (DLB) members on land governance.

Governance

1. Developed a Web-based MIS for Baraza
2. District Budget Framework Papers (BFP) were issued with NPA's certificate and gender and equity certificate in compliance with the provisions of the PFMA.
3. Organised 188 District Budget conferences / District health assembly / Baraza /open social accountability meetings / Community Engagement Platforms (CEP)
4. Constituted 6 Participatory Gender Budget Clubs (PGBCs) to enhance downward accountability. Each PGBC was composed of 15 members.

5. Organised 6 Sub-county Budget conferences
6. Conducted 18 Neighbourhood assemblies/ community dialogues to identify social, economic, and governance issues that limit citizens' participation in governance.
7. Trained 90 PGBCs members in budget tracking and service delivery monitoring, advocacy skills and budget accountability
8. Conducted a Training of Trainers for 12 community-based trainers in budget analysis, expenditure and service delivery.
9. Trained 22 NSA gender budget champions in budget analysis and advocacy
10. Conducted 2 National Budget Month Accountability Event
11. Organised 2 "Know your budget" campaign event
12. Conducted 6 Accountability Week, that comprised of a series of public dialogues, Community Engagement Platforms at village level and different activities.
13. Printed 6,000 posters with messages, both English and the local language on issues of accountability, service delivery, gender-responsiveness and citizen-state-interaction, that were displayed
14. Held 6 CSO trade fair that provided a platform to show case their work to the public and also the CSOs engaged the citizens and agreed on ways of collaboration in improving service delivery.
15. Aired 114 radio talk shows
16. Developed, printed and disseminated 10,700 copies of a Simplified Legal compendium of laws, policies and regulations concerning LG accountability, public resource management and gender inclusion. They are produced in English and translated in 5 Local languages (Ateso, Nga'karimojong, Luo, Acholi and Lugbara).
17. Updated the District Clients Charter (DCC), printed 3,870 copies and disseminated them.
18. Published 10 District Peer Review mechanisms (DPRM) Reports for 2021 and 2022.
19. Trained 196 PDCs in LG planning and budget cycles.
20. Sensitized and trained 798CSOs, Service User Committees (SUC) members on their roles within LG accountability and service delivery (media actors, LC III and LC V councilors) on statutory recommendations and standards.
21. Trained 60 Community Health Advocates (CHA) on their roles and responsibilities in promoting good governance, performance, and accountability
22. Trained 72 district leaders on themes related to good governance, including their mandates and roles in service delivery.
23. Trained 8 CSOs/CBOs on the Human Rights Based Approach, Governance, Accountability, Advocacy at community level and CSO Monitoring tools for service delivery
24. Conducted 42 quarterly joint gender responsive budget monitoring exercises and gender responsive service delivery tracking.
25. Conducted 42 quarterly community dialogues conducted to enhance community engagement on the state of service delivery within their localities.
